TRACK II ADVANCED

This opportunity will prepare interns to select a construction career path—union apprenticeship training, a construction related post-secondary track, or direct entry into the construction workplace, if desired. Interns visit apprentice training centers and receive training and supervision from industry experts as they complete projects using both hand and power tools.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for this internship, you must meet the following Right Track requirements.

ELIGIBILITY

Be 16 years old by June 1 and no older than 21 years old on June 1 and live in Saint Paul. Meet income criteria or have a barrier to employment. Have previous work or volunteer experience (at least 1 full summer or more than 100 hours) or be enrolled in one of the following programs:

BARRIERS TO EMPLOYMENT CAN INCLUDE

- Youth who are pregnant or parenting
- Youth with Limited English Proficiency
- Youth who have dropped out of high school or who have a high potential of dropping out
- Youth who are juvenile offenders or in a diversion program
- Youth receiving public assistance and/or group home services

- Youth with disabilities, including learning disabilities
- Youth in transition (currently homeless or runaway)
- Youth who are chemically dependent or are children of drug or alcohol abusers/dependents
- · Youth with basic skills deficiency
- Youth with educational attainment one or more levels below grade level appropriate to age
- Youth in foster care
